E: Okay. First of all, I'd like to ask you some questions about yourself. Let's talk about what you do. Do you work or are you a student?

S: I'm still a student and learning in Hong Kong U Educ, the Education University of Hong Kong.

E: What subject do you study?

S: I study in the Chinese educations.

E: Why?

S: Because I would like to be a teacher in the future and I'll enjoy the ... the ... the pro, the progress of the teaching.

E: Why?

S: When I had the ... when I talk with the student, I feel very ... I enjoy this moment because the student can learn some knowledge in my course and, and then I can think some method to let them to learn something they don't know.

E: Thank you. Let's talk about free time activities now. What do you like to do in your free time?

S: I love it. I love to reading book in my free times or in some ... in weekend I would like to do some physical exercise such as running because I enjoy running, it's let me to relax in my, after my da, daily work.

E: Do you prefer to spend most of your free time indoors or outdoors?

S: Art. artworks.

E: Why?

S: Because I enjoy the art, artworks because it's made me think a lot about what is beautiful. When I'm reading or when I seeing some pictures in the museum, I feel relax and I, and I would like to ... I enjoy this moment because it's make me feel relax and quiet ... feel quiet.

E: What did you like to do in your free time when you were a child?

- S: When I'm child, I usually go to the McDonald's to eat some ... eat the chips, and, and then I would like to hiking with my grandpa.
- E: What do you plan to do in your free time this weekend?
- S: This weekend? I would, I will, I will go to watching, I will going, I will go to watch the movie.
- E: Let's talk about travel. Do you like to travel?
- S: I love to travel.
- E: Why?
- S: Because travel can let me have a wide, wide seeing and when travel, I can see a lot I haven't see before. Such as I go to China, I have travel in China, I have learn ... I can learn about many culture things in China. Because when I living in Hong Kong, I, I ... many Chinese culture is, is not very traditional. And so I would like to go travel because I would like to see more things I haven't ... I don't know yet.

E: Thank you.

E: Now I'm going to give you a topic and I'd like you to talk about it for one to two minutes. Before you talk, you have one minute to think about what you're going to say and you can make some notes if you wish. You understand?

S: Understand.

E: I'd like you to talk about the type of clothing you like to wear. First of all, you have one minute to prepare.

S: Sorry, can you repeat the question?

E: I'd like you to talk about the type of clothing you like to wear.

S: Okay.

E: (After one-minute preparation) All right. Now remember you've got one to two minutes for this so don't worry if I stop you. I'll tell you when the time is up. Can you start speaking now please?

S: OK. I would like to wear the T-shirt and the short in my daily life because I ... in Hong Kong, the weather is very hot. It make me feel very sweaty when I go out. So I would like to wear some wearing make me feel cool and comfortable. OK. I would like to go to the shopping mall in the weekend to buy some clothing for my daily life, because I have some ... don't have ... busy study time in my ... in the ... in, in, in, day, daytime ... in the Fri ... Monday to the Thursday. So I just have some time as, are free to buy clothes in ... at the weekend. Also I like the Uniqlo, the, the shop of who ... which is named of Uniqlo, I will buy some clothes at there because it has a great design and is the clothing ... the clothes in Uniqlo is very cheap. The, the price is very low. When I wearing T-shirt and the short, I will feel very cool. And I very like to choose this wearing because I can ... when, when I go out, I like to have a shorter prepared time so when I go out, I wear the T-shirt and the short. I'm ...

E: Thank you. Sorry to interrupt you.

- E: So we've been talking about the type of clothing that you like to wear. And now I'd like to ask you one or two more general questions related to this. Let's consider designer clothing. Are designer clothes popular in your country?
- S: Design a clothing is not popular in my country because people would like to buy some clothes in the shopping mall and they will wear the clothes, very, they will wearing the clothes which is buy in the shopping mall. They will not to design their clothes.
- E: For those people who do like to buy designer clothes, why do you think they like to buy them? Why do they like to wear designer clothes?
- S: Because people don't like to design a clothes, but they would like to buy a clothes because they thinks design a clothes is very difficult and they would like to, to make their clothing more easily.
- E: When you say designer clothes is difficult, what, what do you mean?

- S: When the people want to design a clothes, they need to paint, painting their design and they need to put down their idea on the paper and then they need to think how to ... to choose the ... how to make this clothing ... what make of clothing ... of this clothes and then they need to make it out. So I think that they will like ... they will think design a clothes is very wasting time.
- E: Let's turn now to clothes people wear to work. Do you think people at work make judgments about their colleagues? According to the kind of clothes they wear?
- S: People will judge someone wearing to less, because in some country, people ... the, the females ... when they ... when the females wear too sexy, the guys will ... the, the country is ... will judge them wearing too low.
- E: What about in Hong Kong? You know when people see their colleagues come to work dressed in a certain way, did they form an opinion about the person because of their clothes?
- S: I think in Hong Kong people is very open minded. They can ... they can ... they're open minded to the other countries come from different country. So I think in Hong Kong, these people can very comfortable to living in Hong Kong.
- E: Do you think that people should be forced to wear certain clothes to work? Their employer tells them 'You must wear these clothes'. Do you think that's okay?

S: I think people have the right to choose the clothes which they want to wearing. We haven't to, to let the employer feel happy that we wearing the right clothes in the working place. So I think I'm disagree this, this point.

E: Has the way that people dress for work changed in recent times?

S: Sorry, can you repeat the question?

E: In Hong Kong, are people dressing the same way for work as they did in the past, or has it changed?

S: In Hong Kong, people will wear the different clothes in the different place. When they go to work, they will wearing the shirt and the trousers. When they going to happy hour, go to bar, they will wear, wearing very comfortable and the smart casual. So I think ...

E: I will stop you there. Again. Sorry to interrupt. Thank you very much. That's the end of the test.

S: Thank you. Thank you. The Education University of Hong Kong
