Error (21 times)

Inappropriate verb form: 4 times (I *would* like to; I *would* like to; I *would* like to; When I *wearing*)

Singular/ plural noun form: 3 times (I would like to wear the *T-shirt*; When I *wearing T-shirt*; I wear the *T-shirt*)

Subject-verb agreement: 2 times (it *make* me feel very sweaty; the clothes in Uniqlo *is* very cheap)

Missing relative pronoun: 2 times (some *wearing* ^ make me feel cool; I just have some time ^ are free to buy clothes)

Missing possessives: 1 time (When I *wearing* ^ T-shirt)

Missing article: 1 time (in ^ daytime)

Redundant article: 7 times

Redundant verb: 1 time

General description

Less common words: no less common words are identified.

Paraphrase: no paraphrase is coded.

Idiomatic expressions: no idiomatic expression is identified.

Collocations: **3** collocations are coded (Feel very sweaty; Feel cool; Feel very cool).

Appropriacy of the words used: 13 inappropriate use of words are coded.

Inappropriate word choice: 8 times (wear the T shirt and the *short*; wear some *wearing*; T shirt and the *short*; I *very* like to *choose this wearing*; wear the T shirt and the *short*)

Inappropriate collocations: 2 times (*in* the Fri ... Monday *to* the Thursday; name *of*)

Inappropriate word form: 1 time (*prepared* time)

Redundant preposition: 2 times
