### General Description

Less common words: **5** less common words are coded (functionality, minimalist, monotone, timeless pieces, contradict).

Paraphrase: **1** paraphrase is coded.

Must have items → monotone clothes → black, whites, grays, navy blues, all the basics → timeless pieces

Idiomatic expressions: **1** idiomatic expression is identified (good to go).

Collocations: **2** collocations are coded (go hang out, look sharp).

Appropriacy of the words used: no inappropriate use of words is identified.

E-Examiner S-Student

E: Alright now, I'm going to give you a topic, and I'd like you to talk about it for one to two minutes. Before you talk, you have one minute to think about what you're going to say. And you can make some notes if you wish. You understand?

S: Yes.

The other thing is, um, I, I tend to prefer more minimalism ... **minimalist** clothes ... clothing. So types of clothes that's easy to mix and match. They so called the 'must have items' you would have in your closet, though I tend to have very **monotone** clothes, so black, whites, grays, navy blues, all the basics that you could just wake up, pull out random things in the closet and you just **look sharp** and **good to go**. And I think those are **timeless pieces**, you don't have to worry about fashion ... whether it's fashionable, or not ... fashionable or not.
