Error (13 times)

Singular/ plural noun/ pronoun form: 8 times (wear just *T-shirt* and jeans ...; a lot of variety in *T-shirt* and jeans; buy stuff in *store*; a lot of *discounts* codes; a few pair of jeans ... *it*; you can match *it*; you can't see *it* because *it's*)

Subject-verb agreement: 2 times (for a girl ... *is*; because ... *is*)

Missing object: 1 time (you can wear[^])

Redundant article: 2 times

Complex verb group (1 time)

Present continuous

Subordinate clause (9 times)

Relative clause: 5 times

Adverbial clause: 4 times

Noun clause: 0 times

General Description

Less common words: **2** less common words are identified (overwhelmingly; torso).

Paraphrase: 1 paraphrase is coded.

Not too overwhelmingly warm → doesn't overheat you

Idiomatic expressions: no idiomatic expressions are identified.

Collocations: **1** collocation is identified (explore the options).

Appropriacy of the words used: 3 inappropriate uses of words are coded.

Inappropriate word form: 1 time (they *have to offer*)

Inappropriate word choice: 1 time (the *sales* are)

Meaning unclear: 1 time (they *angle* you)

E: Alright. Now I'm going to give you a topic. And I'd like you to talk about it for one to two minutes. Before you talk, you'll have one minute to think about what you're going to say and you can make some notes if you wish. You understand? I'd like you to talk about the type of clothing you like to wear. So first of all, you have one minute to prepare. (*After one-minute preparation*) All right. Now remember, you've got one to two minutes for this so don't worry if I stop you, I'll tell you when the time is up. Can you start speaking now, please?

S: The type of clothing **that I like to wear ... I like to wear just T-shirt and jeans, just because it**

it's not too **overwhelmingly warm** or it **doesn't overheat you**, unlike some ... maybe heat-tech or some kind of sweatpants **that may be too warm**, and it also just fits around your **torso** ... your

body really comfortably. I normally like to buy my clothing ... I like to try it in the store first and then I like to buy it online. It's kind of a trick **that I like to do because normally I, I feel really**
[SUB-relative clause] [SUB-adverbial clause]

pressured to buy stuff in store because the sales are kind of ... in Hong Kong, especially, they're
[stores] [SUB-adverbial clause] [salespeople]

like ... they angle you from a distance, and they're like, 'oh you must buy this' or 'you must try
[Meaning unclear, suggestion: notice]

this' or 'what do you want?'. And I'm just like ... I just kind of wanna try stuff by myself and I just like to, you know, **explore the options that they have to offer**. And so I buy them online. And

there's a lot of **discounts** co, codes online. And yeah, I own quite a few pair of jeans and for a

girl, **it's** pretty comfortable and it's ... you can match **it** with any type of shoes and outerwear.

And like I'm **wearing** ... I'm actually wearing jeans and a T-shirt today. Obviously, you can't see **it**
