Appropriacy of the words used

General Description

Less common words: no less common word is identified.

Paraphrase: 1 paraphrase is coded.

Young children → teenager

Idiomatic expressions: no idiomatic expression is identified.

Collocations: no collocation is identified.

Appropriacy of the words used: 25 inappropriate uses of words are coded.

Inappropriate word choice: 13 times (own *branding*; wear too sexy; they wear not; have some judgement; their *wearing*; they are not *wearing*; have judgement; on their *wearing*; wear in particular way; wear more formal; it is not much; not *more formal than*; on ... *wearing*)

Inappropriate word form: 5 times (most *youngest* children; wear too *sexy*; wear more *formal*; not much *different*; *nowaday* that)

Inappropriate collocations: 3 times (not respect ~~it~~ those situation; more formal than ^ other job; ^ some job)

Meaning unclear: 4 times (*have more topic* with friends; wear not *formula*; are not wearing *formula*; it's not *formula*)

E: So, we've been talking about the type of clothing that you like to wear. And now I'd like to ask you some more general questions related to that. So, let's consider designer clothing. Are designer clothes popular in your country?

S: Design clothes?

E: Designer clothes.

S: Designer clothes ...

E: So, clothes with famous brand names. Are they popular in your country?

S: I think that it is now popular because some YouTuber, they have design the own **branding** **[brands]**

in Hong Kong, so they would use the YouTube channel ... their YouTube channel to sell the clothing to us, so I think ... also, I think that it is the business, so more people would want to earn the money so they may design some clothing that is ... they like, and also is suitable for most **youngest** children or teenager. So, I think this is more popular in Hong Kong now.

E: Why do you think people like to wear clothes with famous brands?

S: I think that they want to ... it's because that ... they think wear that clothes ... that they can follow the, follow the trend. So, they would go to buy the clothes and wearing.

E: Do you think sometimes people worry too much about following the trend?

S: Oh, maybe this is common in teenager because they want to **have more topic** with friends. So **[meaning unclear, suggestion: share more interests]**

when they see the friend buy those clothes, they would want to buy it.

E: Let's turn now to the kind of clothes that people wear to work. Do you think that people make judgments about their colleagues, because of the clothes they wear to work?

S: If ...

E: So, when someone goes to work, dressed in a particular kind of way, do you think their colleagues look at them and make judgments about them?

S: If they work ... they **wear** too **sexy**, or they **wear** **not formula**, I think people will **have** some **[dress] [sexily] [dress] [Meaning unclear, suggestion: informally] [make]** judgement because they think their **wearing** is not ... respect **in** those situation. They are not **[clothing]**

wearing **formula**. So, I think some people will **have** judgement on their **wearing**. **[dressed] [Meaning unclear, suggestion: formally] [make] [clothing]**

E: Should people be forced to wear certain clothes to work? Is it okay for their employer to tell them 'you must dress in this particular way'?

S: I think ... **^** some job need to **wear** in particular way such as lawyer or, some people is doing **[for] [dress]**

some business job, so they need to **wear** more **formal** than **^** other job. **[dress] [formally] [in]**

E: Has the way that people dress for work changed in recent times, do you think?

S: Change?

E: Do people dress a little bit differently now when they go to work, compared to 10 years ago or 20 years ago?

S: I think **it** is not much **different**. But I think **nowaday** that people wearing clothes ... it's **[there] [difference] [nowadays]**

not **formula** ... not, not **more formal than** the people in the past. They would maybe focus more
[Meaning unclear, *suggestion: formally*] **[as formal as]**

on its ... **wearing** feel comfortable to wear.
