Error (22 times)

Singular/ plural noun/ pronoun form: 10 times (clothes ... *it* is; some simple *colour* ... *it* is; clothes ... *it's* very; leggings ... *it* is very ... *it* can let me; these flagship *store*; a lot of *choice* and different *colour*; *this* sports clothes)

Subject-verb agreement: 4 times (clothes ... *it* is; some simple *colour* ... *it* is... *it's* very; leggings ... *it* is very)

Inappropriate verb form: 1 time (are *make* of)

Inappropriate tense: 1 time (as I *mention* before)

Missing article: 1 time (I'm ^*sporty* girl)

Missing object: 1 time (too hot in wearing^)

Redundant article: 4 times

Appropriacy of the words used

General Description

Less common words: 1 less common word is identified (flagship).

Paraphrase: 1 paraphrase is coded.

Very comfortable → won't feel too hot

Idiomatic expressions: no idiomatic expression is identified.

Collocations: no collocation is identified.

Appropriacy of the words used: 4 inappropriate uses of words are coded.

Unclear meaning: 2 times (easy in stretching; I'm not afraid of ... *broken*)

Inappropriate collocation: 1 time (very easy to match my outfit)

Redundant preposition: 1 time
