

E: I'm going to ask you some questions about yourself. First of all, let's talk about what you do. Are you a student?

S: Yes, I'm a year-3 student who major in Social Science.

E: What will you do with your degree after you've finished your studies?

S: I want to be a teacher. But ... however my degree can, cannot give me the certification of being a teacher. So maybe I'll ... going to study a master or a PDGE in my further ... in my further study.

E: Let's talk about free time activities. What do you like to do in your free time?

S: I love outdoor activities like hiking and swimming, so you can see that I have a tanned skin and I'm quite a muscular girl.

E: What did you like to do in your free time when you were a child?

S: Child ... I always go swimming and hiking with my daddy and mommy because they are ... they love outdoor activities too.

E: Why?

S: Because outdoor activities ... we can have some quality time together and it is more, more ... more interesting.

E: What do you plan to do in your free time this weekend?

S: In this weekend is the new year eve. So, we are having a party together with my family and friends. We cooked a lot of food and we will have a ... exchange gift, like the Boxing Day.

E: Let's talk about travel now. Do you like to travel?

S: I like to travel because I think going to different countries can ... can see a different view and to learn their culture. But, however in the COVID-19, we can't go to other countries travel, but I would go to other places in Hong Kong to ... like the Tai O or the other village to see their ... to see the beautiful view.

E: When tourists come to Hong Kong, where do they like to go?

S: In the past few years, they may go to Ocean Park or the Tsim Sha Tsui but I don't recommend them to go to this tourist spot because I think it's too many tourist and, and I would rather recommend them to go to some ... like Tai O or some small village, because there are more culture activities. For example, you can talk to the people who live in there, and you can buy some souvenirs and in Tai O you can buy

some fish products, which is very fresh.

E: Is traveling abroad popular in Hong Kong?

S: I think it is not popular in the past few years, because many people are very busy and if they have the chance to travel or they have the holiday, they would rather go to other countries like in Thailand or Japan. But, however, in this year, you know, we can't go to travel so they may choose to camping or hiking in Hong Kong.

E: Where would you like to travel to in the future?

S: I would like to go to Europe in my ... unfortunately, I've got the exchange opportunities. I choose to go to Sweden but, however, it is cancelled. So I really want to go to Sweden in my future because Sweden is a very cold country and I never saw snow before ... snowing before and I would like to see the, the, the beautiful view of Sweden.

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E: Now I'm going to give you a topic. And I'd like you to talk about it for one to two minutes. Before you talk, you'll have one minute to think about what you're going to say. And you can make some notes if you wish. You understand?

S: Yes.

E: Yes, I'd like you to talk about the type of clothing you like to wear. So first of all, you have one minute to prepare. (After one-minute preparation) Now remember, you've got one to two minutes for this so don't worry if I stop you, I'll tell you when the time is up. Can you start speaking now please?

S: I like to wear sports clothes and, as I mention before, I'm sporty girl. I like outdoor activities. So the sport ... sporty clothes can make me feel comfortable and I think it is very easy to match. And I'll just pick some simple colour like, black and white and grey, and it is very easy to match my outfit. And the sports clothes, most are made of the cotton, and it's very comfortable and, and not ... you won't feel too hot in wearing in summer or doing exercise. And my favourite clothes ... are sport clothes, especially in the leggings ... the sports leggings, because I think it is very ... it can let me easy in stretching and I'm not afraid of ... broken or anything. And I usually buy the sports clothes in the Nike or Adidas, these flagship store in ... of doing sports and they have a lot of choice and different colour ... different, different clothes for doing different sports. And I feel comfortable and happy when wearing this sports, sports clothes. Yes.

E: Thank you.

E: So we've been talking about the kind of clothes you like to wear. And I'd like to ask you some more general questions related to this. So, let's talk about designer clothing. Are designer clothes popular in Hong Kong?

S: I think the designer clothes is ... about the luxury clothes like Chanel or Gucci?

E: That's right.

S: I think it is quite common in Hong Kong, especially in the woman, you know, because they think buying the designer clothes is a, a signal of luxury and it means they can have the money to buy it. And I think it's not a controversial issue because some people may judge them for wearing designer clothes is a show ... showing off themselves, but I think it is just a personal choice and it's okay.

E: Well, you mentioned they're popular amongst women – not amongst men. Why do you think men are not concerned about things like that?

S: Because man is ... doesn't care about the ... I think most of the man doesn't care about the outfit at all. They may just choose something that is comfortable and cheap. And I think the ... most of the man ... to ... would like to choose sport clothes, just like me. And maybe design clothes is just not unnecessary or they didn't love too much.

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E: Let's talk about clothes people wear to work now. Do you think people at work make judgments about their colleagues based on the kind of clothes they wear?

S: I think no, it is not common in Hong Kong. Because most of the workers and like ... at the office, they may wear shirt and a suit in ... working in office. And if you're, are blue-collar workers, they have, have their company uniform. And so I think it is not quite a big problem in Hong Kong.

E: But what if somebody did come to work dressed a little bit differently, would people regard that in a particular kind of way? Would they judge the person then?

S: I think no because most of the people in Hong Kong are nice and polite. And if it is really that case, they maybe, talk to them or give some advice, but would not judge in a very hostile, hostile words.

E: You mentioned uniforms there. Do you think it's reasonable for employers to be able to tell their staff what they should wear to work?

S: I think it's okay because most of the uniform are quite beautiful and some people may think that it's their freedom to wear what they want. But I think you are a employer, you should follow the rules of the company. And I think the uniform is not

a ... is not a very controversial rules and it's okay to follow.

E: Has the way that people dress for work in Hong Kong changed very much over the last few decades?

S: I think no. Of course, the clothes in nowadays are more trendy and fashionable. But I think the types of clothes are most of the ... suit, blouse, dress and trousers ... long trousers. And because some company didn't allow their employees to wear short skirt to go to their work. I think it is reasonable, because when the woman ... ladies wear the short skirt, it's not like ... it's quite dangerous and not suitable to work. So, I think ... not a big change.
