Inappropriate verb form: 5 times (I like to play the badminton and *reading* books; I like *read* the books; I like to *hanging* out ... *hanging* out; is *play* with my buddies)

Inappropriate verb tense: 2 times (I always *play*; I think *is* play)

Missing subject: 1 time (I think ^ is play)

Inappropriate subject: 1 time (I think *it* can taste)

Singular/ plural noun form: 2 times (the big *firms*; your *countries*)

Complex verb group (4 times)

Present Perfect: 2 times

Present Continuous: 2 times

Subordinate clause (8 times)

Appropriacy of the words used

General description

Less common words: **2** less common words are identified (renewable, souvenirs).

Paraphrase: no paraphrase is coded.

Idiomatic expressions: **1** idiomatic expression is identified (hanging out).

Collocations: 1 collocation is coded (renewable energy).

Appropriacy of the words used: 14 inappropriate uses of words are coded.

Inappropriate collocations: 4 times (*apply* ^ the China Resource; *travel* ^ different country; totally different culture *with*; *travel* ^ the Europe)

Inappropriate word choice: 3 times (It's *talking about* a renewable energy facilitate; I dislike *track* at the home; maybe *other* country)

Inappropriate word form: 7 times (after the *graduate*; renewable energy *facilitate*; *differencies* between the rich guys; it's *outdoor*; *culture* styles; go to *German*; *participant* the)
