Consonant error Vowel error Syllable stress error Sentence stress error

General description

Consonant error: 22 times (clothing; that; something; think; thing; clothes; this; them)

Vowel error: 3 times (comfortable; cheap)

Syllable stress error: 1 time (lazy)

Sentence stress error: 2 times
