General Description

Error (10 times)

Singular/ plural noun/ pronoun form: 4 times (these are *something*; these one-piece items that ... I just think that not only *it* is convenient; *these clothings* usually; wearing *these clothings*; my *clothings*)

Subject-verb agreement: 3 times (clothes that *makes*; these one-piece items that ... I just think that not only *it* is convenient; they *makes* me)

Inappropriate tense: 1 time (if the situation is ... then I *would*)

Inappropriate pronoun: 1 time (with *myself*)

Complex verb group (2 times)

Present perfect: 1 time

Present continuous: 1 time

Subordinate clause (10 times)

Adverbial clause: 4 times

Relative clause: 3 times

Noun clause: 3 time

Less common words Paraphrase Idiomatic expressions Collocations  
Appropriacy of the words used

General description

Less common words: **3** less common words are identified (classy; assured; presentable).

Paraphrase: 1 paraphrase is coded.

A-line dresses or maybe even jumpsuits → these one-piece items

Idiomatic expressions: no idiomatic expression is identified.

Collocations: no collocation is coded.

Appropriacy of the words used: 2 inappropriate uses of words are coded.

Inappropriate collocation: 1 time (aim *to* the classy)

Inappropriate word form: 1 time (*confident* boost)

E-Examiner S-Student

E: Alright. Now I'm going to give you a topic. And I'd like you to talk about it for one to two minutes. Before you talk, you have one minute to think about what you're going to say, and you can make some notes if you wish. You understand?

S: Yes.

E: So I'd like you to talk about the type of clothing you like to wear. First of all, you have one minute to prepare. (*After one-minute preparation*) All right. Now remember, you've got one to two minutes for this so don't worry if I stop you, I'll tell you when the time is up. Can you start speaking now please?

S: OK. So, um, the type of clothing **I like to wear** is usually clothes **that makes me look classy**  
[SUB-relative clause] [SUB-relative clause] [make]

because I'm ... I fit ... my type of clothing usually tends to be ... I tend to aim **to** the **classy**. And  
[SUB-adverbial clause] [for]

so I usually wear a shirt, a blouse or sweater with jeans and ... in my daily life. And for example, today I'm **wearing** a sweater and actually I **have brought** a coat along with **myself**. And that ...  
[CVG-present continuous] [CVG-present perfect] [me]

those are ... these are **something** that I would usually wear in my daily life for informal events.  
[somethings] [SUB-relative clause]

For ... maybe if the situation is a little bit more formal like, maybe attending a dinner party or  
[SUB-adverbial clause]

that sort of thing, then I **would** like ... usually choose like A-line dresses or maybe even  
[will]

**jumpsuits** because I actually ... I love jumpsuits and I think that ... especially **these one-piece**  
[SUB-adverbial clause]

**items** that ... I just think that not only **it is** convenient for me to wear because I don't have to think  
[SUB-noun clause] [they] [are] [SUB-adverbial clause]

about how to match the top and the bottom, and I also think that I can feel very confident in them  
[SUB-noun clause]

and they **makes** me ... they actually give me a **confident** boost so that I would walk out and look  
[make] [confidence]

and feel a lot more as, **assured** about myself so ... And also, I find that cloth ... **these clothings**  
[this clothing / these items of clothing / these clothes]

usually, um, um ... **the most important thing about wearing clothes is ... wearing these clothings**  
[SUB-noun clause] [this clothing / these items of clothing / these clothes]

**is to make me feel better about myself** and, and to make me look more **presentable** to others. So  
usually, I choose my type of clothing around that. And I usually go to just famous ... like  
common brands such as Zara and H&M, and those sort of brands to find my **clothings**, so ...  
[clothing / clothes]
